Classroom assistants'* roles vary between schools, but they carry out a huge variety of tasks and schools couldn't function without them.

With the right training, some classroom assistants teach whole classes under the direction of a qualified teacher. Head teachers, teachers, pupils and parents all place huge value on classroom assistants.

Classroom assistants:

- adapt resources for disabled students
- work with individual pupils, small groups and children with special needs
- ★ supervise classes for absent teachers
- ★ manage other classroom support staff
- ★ support pupils' social and emotional well-being
- ★ supervise children on out-of-school activities
- ★ monitor, assess and record pupil data
- ★ run breakfast and after-school clubs
- ★ invigilate exams and tests
- ★ supervise lunch and play times
- ★ prepare learning materials.

And yet they are poorly paid for the responsibility they take; often work unpaid overtime and have insecure contracts.
