





#### About Endeavour

Endeavour are a registered charity offering a wide range of services including front line community based support, group work and counselling for those affected by domestic abuse.

In 1997, a group of women working in the domestic abuse sector were drawn together with a shared purpose to support other women and to provide the UK's first domestic abuse pet fostering service thereby removing a further barrier to leaving.

23 years on, Paws for Kids is a successful independent registered charity and from our Bolton office, the service has grown to deliver several high and medium risk domestic abuse services with our pet fostering extending throughout the northwest of England.

We remain a fully women led and run organisation with women representing 96% of our service users although we actively welcome referrals from men and the LGBTQI+ community.

All our projects are accessible to anyone who is affected by domestic abuse, and we encourage male and LGBTQI+ victims and survivors to access our support.

We were the first domestic abuse charity in the UK to offer an in-house pet fostering service to enable those with pets to flee an abusive household without surrendering or leaving their animals - whole family support is at the heart of what we do, and we believe 'no one gets left behind'

# How Endeavour helps those experiencing domestic abuse

Endeavour provides seven services all associated with Domestic Abuse and Violence including: Safe Haven Project, Haven, Young Person's Domestic Violence Adviser (YPDVA), Young Person's Development Worker (YPDW), Evergreen, Panah Project and our Pet Fostering Service.

## Our main activities are:

- In the community
  we offer whole
  family support, safety
  planning, support through
  legal processes and advice on
  sexual health and physical wellbeing.
  We provide help with food parcels, clothing
  and furniture essentials, as well as running
  group work using the CBT model focusing
  on self-worth and confidence.
- Outreach supporting those in dispersed properties, including bed and breakfasts, hostels, sofa surfing and people experiencing street homelessness
- A Young Persons project supporting women aged 16-19 at high risk of homicide or serious injury.
- A BAME project for women who are isolated due to elements such as language barriers, having no recourse to public funds, those subject to trafficking, those at risk of honour-based violence and those experiencing forced marriage and harmful practices.
- A counselling service supporting people with their mental health and wellbeing through the trauma that comes from living in an abusive relationship.
