2023 - Designated UNISON's Year of Black Workers.

- Over the past few years, we have seen the disproportionate impact of Black workers and communities being hit particularly hard during the pandemic.
- Black workers working on the front line, exposed to Covid, in insecure jobs.
- All this, layered on top of a history of institutional racism. This booklet is an opportunity to showcase and celebrate the fantastic work that has been done throughout the year through a series of pictures.
- The Year of Black Workers has empowered Black workers and their allies and focused our minds, ensuring that everyone is committed to challenging racism and discrimination in the workplace. Change can only happen if we work collectively together to eradicate it.

UNISON is the UK's largest public service trade union with 1.3 million members. Our members work in the public services, and for private contractors providing public services including in the essential utilities.

UNISON developed the Black members leadership programme, which is aimed at increasing the number of Black activists and looking at how UNISON can better support and develop the next activist generation. This project has been focusing on Black members, looking at developing training programmes to support new activists from under-represented groups.

A key feature of this programme is that regions provide ongoing support and identify buddies for these new activists. Now that the programme has been delivered nationally, it has been reviewed, and any additions made will be delivered regionally to ensure that these development programmes are successful in supporting new activists from Black members. A similar scheme has been developed for women members.


The production of the Year of Black Workers toolkit for branches has provided the opportunity for full engagement of UNISON members and activists. The toolkit has worked as a guide to galvanise grassroot support and empower members to contact legislators, as well as to call for policy and procedure changes with employers.

Defining Black leaflet

- In 2014/2015 The National Black Member's Committee carried out extensive work defining Black in UNISON.
- In UNISON Black is used with a capital 'B' in its broad, inclusive and political campaigning sense.
- It sets out to form unity amongst people with a shared history, and who continue to experience racism and diminished opportunities in Britain today.
- Since the 70's the term 'Black' has been used in anti-racist campaigning in recognition of the common struggle against racism and under-representation. Using 'Black' is about creating unity in the fight against deep-rooted racism that sees Black people facing disadvantages in housing, education, employment and the criminal justice and health systems.



The sign-up of the UNISON's Anti-Racism Charter – the anti-racism pledge card with five tips for being an anti-racist ally:

Understanding your privilege

This does not mean you're rich, just that there are some things that you will not experience or haven't had to think about because of who you are. It's important to understand what rights others don't enjoy that you do.

Listen and do your homework.

Listen to Black voices and catch yourself up on the communities you are trying to support.

Speak up, but not over.

An ally's job is to support. You want to make sure that you use your privilege to raise issues but don't drown out voices you're trying to support.

You'll make mistakes! Apologies when you do

It's not about intent but impact, so when you're called out on things, listen and change.

Ally is a verb.

Saying you're an ally is not enough you've got to do the work from the points above.
