# Some cuts don't heal...

The constant changes to the NHS aren't healthy for patients or staff.

Local plans (known as Sustainability and Transformation Plans) have been thrown together too quickly with not enough cash to fund them.

Cuts to hospital beds and staff numbers driven by the need to save money won't improve services for patients.

And any rush to cut or merge services may lead to even more NHS privatisation. Evidence tells us this won't improve services for patients, staff or taxpayers.

Services are also at risk from a looming NHS staffing crisis – with staff leaving for better paid, less stressful jobs – and the potential difficulty of employing European staff after the UK leaves the EU.

The government could resolve these issues if it wanted to. The world's fifth largest economy should have health spending to match but the government continues down its disastrous cost-slashing path.

We can't go on like this.

- the government brings health spending back up to the EU average

- the NHS is employing the right number of staff, with the right mix of skills to care for patients safely.

That's why this government needs to demonstrate to patients, the public and staff that they value the NHS and will ensure that it gets the funding it needs in the future.
